Chapter 4—Fees Charged by the Board of Pharmacy**

PROPOSED AMENDMENT

20 CSR 2220-4.010 General Fees. The board is amending section (1).

PURPOSE: This amendment increases initial and renewal licensing fees.

PUBLIC COST: This proposed rule will not cost state agencies or political subdivisions more than five hundred dollars (\$500) in the aggregate.

PRIVATE COST: This proposed amendment is estimated to cost private entities seventy-eight thousand two hundred ninety-five dollars (\$78,295) beginning in FY25 and annually thereafter; eighty-seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$87,500) beginning in FY 25 and annually thereafter; three hundred twenty thousand six hundred fifty dollars (\$320,650) beginning in FY26 and biennially thereafter; and three hundred sixty-two thousand five hundred dollars (\$362,500) beginning in FY27 and biennially thereafter for the life of the rule.
